Re: Request for Attorney General's Opinion: Powers of County Commissioners – Duties of County Administrator to select and fill vacancies in positions for employment under the jurisdiction of the Board – Extent of participation by County Commissioner in selection and hiring process

Dear Ms. Bondi:

I write you as counsel for the Escambia County Board of County Commissioners. The Board of County Commissioners at its meeting held on October 20, 2011, directed that I respectfully request your opinion as well as your review on questions of law related to a county commissioner's involvement in the selection process for a county employee. Please be aware the Board of County Commissioners also requested other agencies review the matter in question to determine whether the commissioner violated any law or exceeded his power and authority.

Escambia County is a non-charter county with five single-member districts and a contracted county administrator. Pursuant to §125.01, Fla. Stat., a board of county commissioners has broad powers to carry on county government, as enumerated in the statute. In particular, §125.01(3)(a), Fla. Stat., provides that this enumeration of powers is not exclusive nor restrictive, but is deemed to incorporate all implied powers necessary to carry out the specified powers including the authority to employ personnel. Part III of Chapter 125 is entitled "County Administration Law of 1974," the purpose of which is to place "...in the hands of a county administrator the multitude of details which must necessarily arise from the operation of a county...[and] enables the board of county commissioners to perform freely, without unnecessary interruption, its fundamental intended purpose of making policies within the framework of law applicable to county government in this state." Pursuant to §125.71, Fla. Stat., the county administrator is also given enumerated powers, which are not limited, but which include

the power to select, employ and supervise all personnel, fill all vacancies, positions or employment under the jurisdiction of the board and to suspend, discharge or remove any such employee. See § 125.74(1)(k) and (l), Fla. Stat.

For purposes of this inquiry, the following summary of facts is relevant:

The Board of County Commissioners of Escambia County has adopted certain policies through its Division of Human Resources for the selection of unclassified employees, who are at-will employees. In summary, Human Resources prepares a public notice advertising the position and salary range of an unclassified position and invites interested applicants to submit an online application. Once applications are received, a selection committee is usually convened to review the applications and make recommendations to the County Administrator or his designee as to those candidates it deems worthy of further consideration. A grouping of candidates is then usually interviewed and ranked according to their qualifications and abilities to perform. A recommendation is then made to the County Administrator or his designee for selection.

Approximately ten years ago, Escambia County built a public facility known as the Equestrian Center. It is maintained and operated by the County and is offered as a venue for equestrian events, dog trials, dog shows and other outdoor events. The Equestrian Center has never produced sufficient income to cover its operational costs.

In November 2008, Wilson Robertson was elected as the County Commissioner to represent District 1 for Escambia County. Mr. Robertson, according to information given to this office, met with interested persons about turning the Equestrian Center into an income-producing public facility that would meet its original purpose. One of the recommendations he received was that the Equestrian Center needed a full-time manager with ties to the equestrian community to be able to bring in income-producing events. In April, 2011, the Board of County Commissioners approved creating the position of an Equestrian Center Manager and established an \$80,000 budget for the position, to include an estimated starting salary of \$60,000 plus any benefits. A copy of those minutes is attached.

Using its normal policies and procedures, the Division of Human Resources advertised for an Equestrian Center Marking and Promotions Coordinator using only the first quartile of the budgeted amount. Accordingly, the position was advertised at an annual salary range of \$44,803.20 to \$51,521.60. A copy of the position listing is enclosed. Sixty-four applicants submitted on-line applications. The selection committee was named by County Administrator Randy Oliver and consisted of Barbara Keyser, Human Resources Supervisor, Michael Rhodes, Manager of the Parks & Recreation Division, and Larry Newsom, Assistant County Administrator.

One of the applicants was Forrest Gibbs who listed Commissioner Robertson as a reference. Two other Commissioners were listed as references for other applicants.

Forrest Gibbs is a member of a long-time, well-connected family in Escambia County. Commissioner Robertson was friendly with Mr. Gibbs' family, particularly his father. After media reports were published concerning the hiring of Mr. Gibbs, Commissioner Robertson learned that Mr. Gibbs has a business interest with Commissioner Robertson's partner, Lamar Brazwell, subsequently involved in an arm's length transaction irrelevant for this inquiry. Commissioner Robertson has told this office and the media that he did not know of this business connection until it was published in the media.

Commissioner Robertson has told this office that prior to knowing that Mr. Newsom had been named to the selection committee, he spoke to Mr. Newsom and told him that Mr. Gibbs would be a good candidate for the Equestrian Center Manger position. Human Resources and then the selection committee narrowed the field of applicants to eight finalists, with Mr. Gibbs being one of the eight finalists. Interviews were conducted of all finalists, but the selection committee did not rank the finalists. Mr. Newsom, head of the selection committee, recommended to Mr. Oliver that Forrest Gibbs be hired for the position of Equestrian Center Manager.

After the selection of Mr. Gibbs, it appears there was some confusion as to what the Board had budgeted as a salary for the manager position. Commissioner Robertson states he then met with Mr. Oliver and reminded him that \$80,000 had been allocated for the manager position. At the invitation of Mr. Newsom, Commissioner Robertson attended a meeting of the selection committee to learn what the committee was going to offer Mr. Gibbs for salary and benefits. Mr. Newsom also invited me to that meeting because one of the issues discussed was whether it was appropriate to negotiate a salary for Mr. Gibbs which was in excess of the advertised range. I stated at the meeting that negotiating a salary in excess of the advertised range was legal, but it was not a recommended practice and left the meeting before Commissioner Robertson did.

An offer letter was given to Mr. Gibbs with two performance standards which I reviewed and determined was in legal form. Enclosed is a copy of the signed offer letter. As you can see, Mr. Gibbs was required in his first year of employment to obtain additional income for the Equestrian Center in an amount not less than \$80,000, which was the budgeted amount for his position. By the second year, he was required to bring the operating deficit for the Equestrian Center to zero. Should he fail to reach either of those performance standards, then he would be terminated. Mr. Gibbs was an unclassified employee and could be terminated at will upon 30 days notice irrespective of meeting the above performance standards.

Once Mr. Gibbs was hired, adverse publicity was generated in the media and public concern was voiced that Commissioner Robertson exceeded the powers of his office and had wrongfully influenced the selection of Mr. Gibbs. Allegations were also made that he may have misused his position in violation of § 112.313(6), Fla. Stat., which provides that no public officer shall corruptly use or attempt to use his or her official position to secure a special privilege, benefit or exemption for himself or others. Section 112.312(9), Fla. Stat., defines "corruptly" as "...done with a wrongful intent and

for the purpose of obtaining, or compensating or receiving compensation for, any benefit resulting from some act or omission of a public servant which is inconsistent with the proper performance of his or her public duties."

At the regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners on October 20, 2011, after receiving much public comment and scrutiny from the local media, Commissioner Robertson asked that the Board authorize this office to seek an opinion from your office, as well as other agencies, as to whether Commissioner Robertson's conduct in the selection and hiring of Mr. Gibbs violated any law. Certainly this letter recites only a summary of the facts involved and only as they were provided to me or my office. An investigation may yield different or additional facts that could be considered relevant. That said, this office requests your opinion on the following questions:

- 1. Does the County Administration Law of 1974 limit the extent and nature of the participation of a County Commissioner in the hiring or removal of an employee under the jurisdiction of the Board?
- 2. Did Commissioner Robertson's recommendation to County staff to select Mr. Gibbs unduly influence the selection process by frustrating the purpose of the County Administration Law of 1974 which places in the County Administrator the power to select or remove an employee?
- 3. Do the broad powers with which a board of county commissioners is granted through § 125.01(3)(a), Fla. Stat., to exercise all implied powers necessary to carry out its enumerated powers, including the authority to employ personnel, provide either the board or an individual commissioner the power to make recommendations for and participate in the hiring of a particular person for a vacant position?



Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing the reverse side and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which inures to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also is prohibited from knowingly voting on a measure which inures to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person

- Increases the funding for bridge renovations by \$3,700,000.
- Increases the funding for resurfacing and lane widening by \$10,500,000.
- Increases the funding for the Perdido Key Fire Station by \$5,000,000 bringing the total budget to \$5,398.887.
- Increases the funding for Saufley Landfill by \$2,000,000 bringing the total budget to \$7,900,000.
- Provides \$6,000,000 for Kingsfield/Quintette/Well Line Roads.
- Provides \$350,000 for sidewalks on Burgess Road contingent on funding from the City of Pensacola.







RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation Concerning the Reprioritization of Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) Funds and the Transfer of Ownership of Oliva Road and Airport Boulevard - Amy Lovoy. Management & Budget Services Department Director

That the Board take the following action concerning the Reprioritization of Local Option Sales Tax (LOST) funds and the Transfer of Ownership on Olive Road and Airport Boulevard:

- A. Reprioritize LOST projects, according to the spreadsheet including \$6 million in funding for developmental roads in the Northwest Sector Plan (Kingsfield, Well Line, Quintette). The Development Group acknowledges that this funding is insufficient to construct these roads and agrees to prioritize, within available funding, the roadways in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the parties within six months of the approval of this Recommendation. If the Development Group fails to mutually agree upon the priorities for these roadways within this time frame, the funds shall be reallocated to Bridge Renovations;
- B. Authorize the transfer process necessary to accept Olive Road (SR 290) between CR 95A and Scenic Highway (U.S. 90) from the State of Florida;
- C. Authorize the process to transfer Airport Boulevard, between 1-110 (SR 8A) and U.S. 29, from Escambia County to the State of Florida; and
- D. Authorize the transfer of the Pinestead-Longleaf connector, once constructed, from Escambia County to the State of Florida.

(This Recommendation will reprioritize projects in LOST by adding additional projects and moving other projects to different years. Funding for the additional projects will come from the Equestrian Center, the library construction project, funds remaining after the completion of the Central Office Complex and funds that were previously unallocated over the life of the tax. There will be \$1,000,000 remaining in the library construction project and \$1,611,416 unallocated through Fiscal Year 2018 if this action is approved. This action presumes that all current LOST revenue estimates will be met. If the estimates are not met, projects will have to be deleted or delayed.)

BACKGROUND:

The attached spreadsheet details a reprioritization of LOST funding and includes the following:

- Increases the Molino project budget by a total of \$1,800,000 bringing the total budget to \$4,389,156.
- Includes \$1,500,000 for a Stefani Road building expansion.
- Increases the funding for Olive Road by \$3,000,000 bringing the total budget to \$6,385,669.
- Increases the funding for bridge renovations by \$3,700,000.
- Increases the funding for resurfacing and lane widening by \$10,500,000.
- Increases the funding for the Perdido Key Fire Station by \$5,000,000 bringing the total budget to \$5,398,887.
- Increases the funding for Saufley Landfill by \$2,000,000 bringing the total budget to \$7,900,000. (Based on current estimates this reduces the average cross section from 48 to 33 feet).
- Provides \$6,000,000 fδς Kingsfield/Quintette/Well Line Roads.
- Provides \$350,000 for sidewalks on Burgess Road contingent on funding from the City of Pensacola.
- Includes \$2,700,000 for a PD&E study on an I-10 interchange in Beulah.
- Increases the funding for a Hwy. 297A drainage project by \$3,000,000 bringing the total budget for projects on Hwy. 297A to \$9,431,497.
- Includes \$400,000 for improvements at Wedgewood Park.
- Includes \$600,000 for an expansion to the L Street stormwater pond.
- Includes \$400,000 for a project on E Street (Leonard to Cervantes).
- Includes funding for one additional personnel position at the Equestrian Center for two (2) years to market the facility.

BUDGETARY IMPACT:

This agenda Item will reprioritize projects in LOST by adding additional projects and moving other projects to different years. Funding for the additional projects will come from the Equestrian Center, the library construction project, funds remaining after the completion of the Central Office Complex and funds that were previously unallocated over the life of the tax.

There will be \$1,000,000 remaining in the library construction project and \$1,611,416 unallocated through FY2018 If this action is approved.

This action presumes that all current LOST revenue estimates will be met. If the estimates are not met, projects will have to be deleted or delayed.
