Minority representation	2 directors named by the African American Chamber of Commerce	“the Board shall be required to represent Escambia County by race, gender and geography”
Mission	Tourism promotion and leaves open possibility of vetting TDT applications if requested by BCC	Promoting tourism and common business interests
Removal from Board of Directors	Malfeasance, fraud, felony conviction, supporting competing TDT interests, attendance or insolvency	By 2/3 vote of the Board when in the best interest of the Corporation
Dissolution	All assets would go to Escambia County	Public, liquid assets to the TDC; all physical assets to Escambia County BCC; private funds go to private tourism partners (bylaws includes segregated funds)
