




City holds first workshop for Port Vision Plan and Reinvestment Strategy

The first of two community work sessions for the Port's Vision Plan and Reinvestment Strategy is in the books.

Citizens had the opportunity to share their ideas of how the 50 acres of waterfront property should be utilized. City employees and maritime planning experts, Moffatt & Nichol, held the first round of workshops on June 26 and 27.





About 55 people attended the June 26 morning session to get an overview of the project. Scott Lagueux, director of waterfront planning, made the presentation and offered a timeline for the project.

The consultants are looking for community feedback to answer the question of how Pensacola's Port land should evolve to meet the economic and social opportunities of the next 50 years.



The port has served as a pivotal transportation and trade gateway for northwest Florida since its establishment. Over the next four months, the consultants will dive deep and explore ideas, uses and community priorities for some, or all of the Port. The goal is that by October, the city council will be presented with a plan for the Port's future.

Project Schedule

This project schedule outlines the general overview of the Portside Pensacola Planning effort.



In addition to the workshop, there is an online survey. The survey asks a variety of questions about how the current port is viewed and hosts a community comment board for surveyors to like, reply and agree with other surveyors.

A second round of community work sessions will be held late July or early August.

Ferries are up and running just in time for the beginning of summer

On June 22, the Pensacola Bay ferry service operated its first rides for the public.



The City of Pensacola has been working with the National Park Service to bring a ferry service to the area. Right now, the service shuttles people between downtown Pensacola, Fort Pickens and the Santa Rosa Sound side of Pensacola Beach.

Each ride is about 45 minutes and food and beverages are sold onboard.

Work is underway to construct the permanent terminal building in downtown Pensacola. The project is expected to complete by the end of October. Temporary ticketing facilities will be used for the 2018 season.

First responders help collect over 34,000 pounds of food for Manna Food Pantries

Operation #DonutStrike4Manna was a tough challenge, but Pensacola first-responders helped pull it off flawlessly.



The Pensacola Fire Department, Pensacola Police Department, Escambia Fire Rescue and Escambia County Sheriff's Office gave up eating donuts for the good of our community.

From June 20-22, firefighters and officers swore off the delicious small fried dough rings and helped collect food and cash for Manna Food Pantries.

They were stationed at different places throughout Pensacola and Escambia County to accept donations.

Manna Food Pantries set the goal at 30,000 pounds, or 15 tons. They surpassed that goal and collected 34,707 pounds! That amount is equivalent to 26,030 meals and can feed 8,677 people a day.


