




One in five households in Escambia are African American.






Only 4% of households in Santa Rosa are African-American.

What was the rate of growth for non-Hispanic people in the MSA over the past 10 years?









Location Quotient





Where did black residents move within Santa Rosa County?
















Job Growth for African Americans by Wages and # Employed

What is an economic multiplier?

As applied to a local community, a multiplier is a measure of how dollars interjected into a community are respent, thereby leading to additional economic activity.


