- EOC Level 2-Partial activation
- EOC open from 8am-5pm-however, EOC staff are working from home remotely as needed for the weekend.
- As of 1630, 4/3/2020, the County has 112 positive COVID cases.
- Sacred Heart, Community Health, and Baptist Hospital has testing sites mobilized.
- All testing sites require pre-screening phone call.
- All government operations are working with limited public access, essential operations only, working by phone or internet. Work-from-home is being implemented on a limited basis where possible.
- Limited feeding services are being provided in the community weekdays. See ESF 6 notes below for yesterday's data.
- ESF 8 and Logistics working to fulfill medical supply needs through State Logistics.
- CSA mobilized on 3/22/2020. Staff are on call for very sporadic supply delivery.

		ESCAMBIA COUNTY, FL – Escambia County Area Transit (ECAT) will move bus routes to a modified schedule starting on Monday, March 23, 2020. The safety, health and security of our	

customers, employees and our community are our top priorities, therefore, the ECAT is taking steps to mitigate potential exposure of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Hours and Service Modifications:

Effective on Monday, March 23, 2020 and continuing through April 14, 2020, our weekday bus routes will run on a modified schedule. This modified weekday schedule will match our "Holiday Schedule", which runs every two hours and with the final route trips departing ECAT and Downtown at 6:00 p.m. The same modified schedule will run on Saturdays and no service on Sundays. We will temporarily suspend the following routes until further notice:

- Route 41, East Pensacola Heights
- Route 59A, NAS Pensacola, Airport
- Route 59X, NAS Pensacola, Downtown, Cordova Mall
- Route 61, Pensacola Beach
- Route 64, Beach Jumper
- UWF Regular Trolley Service

Routes 1, 2, 31, 32, 43, 44, 45, 47, 48, 50, 51, 52, 55, 57, 58, 60, and 63 will continue to operate modified schedule service Monday – Saturday. UWF Express Trolley will also continue service Monday - Saturday.

Capacity Limit 10 Passengers: ECAT will be scaling capacity to increase social distancing and safety for the general public as well as employees. Buses will be limited to transporting 10 people and encourage staggered seating. Additional vehicles will be dispatched to ensure all passengers are picked up and complying with the 10- person limit.

Escambia County Community Transportation (ECCT) will temporarily suspend all paratransit services after 7:00 p.m. for weekday and Saturday services. All medical necessary trips will be honored. Sunday service is temporarily suspended. All expired eligibility will be extended for 90 days. As of March 26, 2020, ECAT has provided employees to the Emergency Manpower Pool assisting Waste Services, Building Facilities, Animal Services, Road Department and Emergency Operations Center.

ECAT is actively sanitizing the main terminal, all service vehicles, bus shelters and benches. -Baptist Hospital, Community Health of Northwest Florida and West Florida Hospital and Sacred Heart have been submitting specimen collection data to the ESF-8 Desk. Starting tomorrow (April 2, 2020), Dr. Lanza will provide the specimen collection data to the ESF-8 Desk. Data should be the same as the report provided to our IC.
-ESF-8 is continuing Mission Entries with incoming Resource Requisition Request Forms. EM Logistics is handling received resources and distribution to our healthcare partners. Feeding Florida is currently able to maintain food distribution to Feeding the Gulf Coast.

No significant impacts to local Law Enforcement's ability to respond to calls for service are being reported. Check point on I-10 being manned. Local jurisdictions providing security for the test sites in their jurisdictions. ESF 16 lead is monitoring WebEOC for any requests or changes effecting ESF 16 agencies.

ECISO: We have 17 employees self-quarantining (Combination of civilian and sworn staff). No reported manpower shortages. No interruption to the response to calls for service. Front lobby of the Sheriff's Office is closed until further notice. Providing random patrols of the COVID-19 testing site locations during it's hours of operations.
