Santa Rosa County Animal Services was approached about taking cats from Pensacola Humane Society's cat population in order to ensure they received proper care while the organization dealt with their current situation. On December 29, 2022 all of the records of 81 cats were sent to us via our computer software by the Pensacola Humane Society. Despite being over capacity, we felt an obligation to help as the Humane Society has helped us many times in the past and has been a vital asset to the community. A formal written confirmation was obtained from the Pensacola Humane Society Board President authorizing this transfer and we began the process of contacting each foster parent to come up with individualized plans for all their foster animals. Thirty of these animals have already been adopted out to their forever homes and others are waiting to be adopted once their spay or neuter surgeries are completed. We are committed to ensuring none of the animals will be euthanized in this process as we ourselves maintain a no kill status. We are working with the Pensacola Humane Society Board and the organization's previous employees to make this situation as smooth as we can. At this time, we have committed to each animal in our care, and we will oversee any medical care that they need. Please rest assured that our primary goal is to help the community and its animals. As always, your support is appreciated, and we are sincerely grateful for all of those who have reached out to help with the influx of animals in our care. It truly takes a village to do this life saving work and we are grateful to be a part of this.
