By 2020, we will rank in the **top half** of Florida counties, with 435 additional children ready for kindergarten.



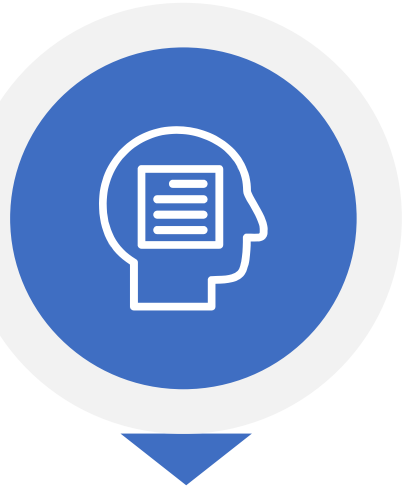
